

YOUTH SPEAKS OUT! IS AN ENRICHMENT PROGRAM OFFERED AT PARTNER ORGANIZATIONS AND IN BALTIMORE CITY PUBLIC SCHOOLS. YOUTH ARE TRAINED TO CREATE A VARIETY OF MEDIA INCLUDING ANIMATION, PHOTO COMICS, SHORT DOCUMENTARY VIDEOS, AND PHOTOGRAPHIC SELF-PORTRAITS. THE GOAL OF THE PROGRAMS IS TO HELP YOUTH THINK CRITICALLY ABOUT THEIR LIVES AND COMMUNITIES, WHILE PROVIDING ACCESS TO CUTTING-EDGE MEDIA TECHNOLOGY. IN ADDITION TO THESE FY12 PARTNERSHIPS, WIDE ANGLE PROVIDED PHOTOGRAPHY WORKSHOPS TO 56 YOUTH IN PARTNERSHIP WITH 8 SCHOOLS AND AFTERSCHOOL PROGRAMS INCLUDING THE GOODNOW COMMUNITY CENTER, MARGARET BRENT ELEMENTARY MIDDLE SCHOOL, AND MONTESSORI PUBLIC CHARTER SCHOOL. THESE WORKSHOPS FOR YOUNG PEOPLE CONSIST OF 2 TWO-HOUR SESSIONS IN WHICH STUDENTS WORK WITH OUR FESTIVAL COORDINATOR TO LEARN BASIC PHOTOGRAPHY SKILLS AND CREATE PHOTOGRAPHS ABOUT THEIR EXPERIENCE AS A YOUNG PERSON IN BALTIMORE.

WIDE ANGLE'S SUMMER MEDIA PROJECT IS AN INTENSIVE CRASH-COURSE IN VIDEO PRODUCTION FOR YOUTH AGES 14-20. THE PROGRAM COVERS THE BASICS OF CAMERA OPERATION, AUDIO PRODUCTION, VIDEO EDITING, SCRIPT-WRITING, STORYBOARDING, AND SET MANAGEMENT. AFTER COMPLETING A SERIES OF SKILL-BUILDING EXERCISES, PARTICIPANTS WILL WORK IN SMALL GROUPS TO WRITE AND PRODUCE A 2-4 MINUTE SHORT FILM THAT WILL BE SCREENED AT THE END OF THE CAMP. 12 STUDENTS PARTICIPATED IN THE SUMMER MEDIA PROJECT IN FY12.
